**SHALLCITY TAXES BE INCREASED \$59,900,000.00 (FIRST YEAR) BY LEVY .9% SALES/USE TAX FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS, PUBLIC SAFETY PERSONNEL/ EQUIPMENT/OPERATIONS AND BE EXEMPT FROM TABOR SPENDING/REVENUE LIMITATIONS?"						
If approved, the City of Colorado Springs shall be authorized to increase its sales and use tax by .9% to finance capital improvements that improve traffic congestion and safety, control flooding, provide family/youth recreation facilities, address neighborhood revitalization needs, and fund public safety personnel, equipment and operations, including necessary internal support as recommended by the Citizens' Coordination Committee of the Springs Community Improvements Program (SCIP 01) and as approved by City Council, and without limiting the collection or spending of any other revenues or funds by the City under TABOR, Article X, Section 20 of the Colorado Constitution and Article VII, Section 7-90 of the City Charter, and without the increase being subject to TABOR under Article X, Section 20 of the Colorado Constitution and Article VII, Section 7-90 of the City Charter. This tax will not affect groceries, prescriptions, residential utility bills and other items as detailed in the City Code. This increase in sales and use tax will be placed in a dedicated fund and will not replace local funds already budgeted for public safety operations. When these projects have been completed, future projects shall be prioritized by a citizens' group which shall recommend these projects and services to City Council for approval.
